

VISITING THE DENTIST

Who are the people that help us at the dental surgery?

- Dentist they count our teeth and make sure that they are clean and healthy. They will also repair our teeth if there is anything wrong with them.
- Dental Therapist they care for our teeth and also help teach us about healthy mouths.
- Dental Nurse they help the dentist.
- Dental Hygienist they clean and polish our teeth and help teach us about teeth too.
- Receptionist they meet you when you arrive and make appointments.



- What do they remember?
- Where did/would they wait?
- Did/would they do anything while they waited?
- Did/would the dentist count their teeth?
- Did/would they tell the dentist anything about their teeth (wobbly, check-up, eating sweets, cleaning their teeth)?
- All children should have their first dental check-up by the age of 1 year.

A VISIT TO THE DENTIST

- You go to the desk and tell the receptionist your name. She will tell the dentist that you have arrived.
- You will then have a seat in the waiting room.
- When the dentist is ready for you, the dental nurse will come to the waiting room and call your name.
- The dentist will ask you to sit in the big, special chair.
- When you sit in the chair, the dentist will press a button and the special chair will move. It will lie you down - like you're in your bed. It is very comfy.
- The dentist will say 'open wide' and when you open your mouth, the
 dentist will use a tiny mirror on a stick to look into your mouth and
 count your teeth.
- The dental nurse will write down the number of teeth that you have.
- When the dentist has counted all your teeth, they will press the button again and the special chair will sit you up again so you can hop off.
- The dental nurse will give you a sticker for being an amazing patient.
- Your dental check-up is now finished, so you will go back to see the receptionist, where you will be given another appointment for next time.





ACTIVITIES

- Rearrange the pictures of a visit to the dentist, into the correct order.
- Create a Dental Practice in the nursery environment.
 The children can draw and colour in signs for the dental practice.
 They can then use role play to re-enact a visit to the dentist. Taking it in turns to be the dentist, the dental nurse, the dental hygienist and the receptionist.

- Pictures of the sequence of visiting the dentist. Children encouraged to place in the correct order.
- Record cards and appointment cards.
- Masks, gloves and mouth mirrors, to recreate a dental check-up.
- An appointment book or diary sheets to make appointments.
- Computer/typewriter.
- Reception desk and chair.
- Telephone.
- Pens/pencils.
- Magazines and books.
- Posters.
- Clock.
- Calendar.
- Toothbrushes and accessories to sell.
- Till.


